

## 2009 Smallbore Conventional 3-Position Rifle Regional Championship

**Date:** June 27 – 28, 2009

**Location:** Wallingford, CT

**Sponsoring location:** Blue trail Range

**Rule:** Current NRA Smallbore Rifle rules will govern

**Eligibility:** Open to all competitors, membership in NRA is NOT required

Teams will consist of 2 or 4 firing members, a coach or captain if desired, and will represent either a club, Rule 2.11, 2.11.1, a law enforcement agency, Rule 2.14, a regular service unit or a reserve unit (including National Guard) Rule 2.13. The team captain and/or coach may be firing members of the team.

**Entries:** Individuals: Entries in individual events will be made by using the enclosed registration card, accompanied by check or money order. Circle the number of each event in which you wish to fire. Be sure to indicate your correct NRA classification and NRA membership number if you have one. If you are not an NRA member, a number will be assigned you for classification purposes only. Mail entries to Blue Trail Range, 316 North Branford Rd., Wallingford, CT 06492

Individual entries must be received no later than the Monday preceding the opening date of the tournament. Team match entries close at 12:00 noon the day the team matches are fired.

Entries are limited to 120 competitors

Post entries will be accepted up to the stated limit of the range, provided such entries will not require the squadding of extra relays.

### **Fees:**

NRA individual registration fee: \$39.00

Individual matches: \$18.00 \$9.00 per competitor each

Team match: \$25.00 per team (NRA team fee \$5.00)

package fee: \$57.00

Souvenir pins will be given to each individual who competes.

**Rifle:** Rule 3.2

**Target:** NRA official targets will be used

**Challenges:** A challenge fee of \$1.00 will be charged for each challenge made. See NRA Rule 16 for correct procedure

**Squadding tickets:** All matches will be squadded. Squadding will be done from the Statistical Office. **NRA classification cards may be checked by the statistical officer.** Squadding information for team matches will be announced on the range. A competitor who fails to present himself at the proper firing point when the relay is called may lose his right to compete in that event

**Classification:** The NRA classification system will be used in all matches. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master class. Rule 19.6 – assigned classification, or 19.2 – temporary classification, may be used in making entry in an NRA regional tournament

**Awards:** To the winner, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place overall, medallions (provided entries warrant) and the winning team awards in the team matches are furnished by the NRA. The tournament sponsor **will** provide awards for all **fired** matches and **aggregates**. Sponsor will post on the bulletin board an award schedule after entries have closed and before the tournament begins.

**Class and Category:** Class and category will be determined by the number of entries in each. Classes and categories that have enough entries to stand alone, will. Classes/categories with insufficient entries will be combined for awards. (Exception, see page 4: Camp Perry entry fee credit certificates) Tournament sponsor will include the award distribution he prefers, i.e. 1<sup>st</sup> place for 5 entries, 2<sup>nd</sup> place for 8 entries, 3<sup>rd</sup> place for 13 entries, etc.

**Special awards:** (Senior and Junior) An individual winning a place award shall be entitled to Special Awards for which he or she is qualified, but may not win a category/class award in the same match. Such awards will be passed down to the next eligible competitor. To be eligible for a Special Award the individual must indicate on his or her entry card the groups represented.

**Class awards:** The category/class awards will also be passed down, as described above, if an individual is the winner of a special award.

**Regional Awards Schedule  
(furnished by the NRA and supplemented by Blue Trail Range)**

**Grand Aggregate**

- Winner:** 60 award points and NRA Regional Gold Medallion (with a minimum of 5 shooters)  
**2<sup>nd</sup> place:** 50 award points and NRA Regional Silver Medallion (with a minimum of 10 shooters)  
**3<sup>rd</sup> place:** 25 award points and NRA Regional Bronze Medallion (with a minimum of 15 shooters)

**Awards for fired team matches – Metallic sight and any sight**

NRA and conventional 3 and 4 position only – 10 award point for each team member of winning team in each team match (furnished by NRA). All other awards will be furnished by Blue Trail Range. (Awards to the Open Team Match winners are the minimum awards required)

**NRA National Championship Certificate Award**

Certificates for 50% off Camp Perry entry fees are awarded to class winners. Only one award may be earned per class. At least ten shooters must be in a class to win a certificate. Classes may be combined upward (NRA Rule 9.8.1) to make a class of ten shooters. Regionals of less than ten shooters are not eligible for the NRA National Smallbore Rifle Championship certificate. Certificates are won in NRA conventional/metric prone regionals and in NRA 3-position or conventional position regionals. Only one prone certificate may be won per year. Only one position certificate may be earned per year. A shooter may earn one prone and one position certificate per year and both certificates may be applied to the National Smallbore Rifle Championships if a shooter desires to shoot both championships. Certificates may be passed down to the next lowest shooter in a class at the same regional tournament. Certificates are the property of the NRA who may refuse to honor any certificate for any reason at any time.

**Awards Furnished by Blue Trail Range**

**Category and class awards (Grand aggregate)**

For each class in each category:

- 1<sup>st</sup> place: 15 award points (with a minimum of 5 shooters in class or category)  
2<sup>nd</sup> place: 10 award points (with a minimum of 8 shooters in class or category)  
3<sup>rd</sup> place: 5 award points (with a minimum of 13 shooters in class or category)

**Winner:**

Metallic sight aggregate: 20 award points  
Any sight aggregate: 20 award points

**Category and class awards: in the metallic sight aggregate or any sight aggregate. For each class in each category.**

- 1<sup>st</sup> place: 15 award points (with a minimum of 5 shooters in class or category)  
2<sup>nd</sup> place: 10 award points (with a minimum of 8 shooters in class or category)  
3<sup>rd</sup> place: 8 award points (with a minimum of 13 shooters in class or category)

**Awards for individual fired matches, provided by Blue trail Range:**

- 1<sup>st</sup> place in class or category: 7 award points (with a minimum of 5 shooters in class or category)  
2<sup>nd</sup> place in class or category: 5 award points (with a minimum of 8 shooters in class or category)  
3<sup>rd</sup> place in class or category: 3 award points (with a minimum of 13 shooters in class or category)
